ARTICLE 8.

The Constitution shall be the supreme law of the Republic of Poland. ARTICLE 9.

The Republic of Poland shall respect international law binding upon it. ARTICLE 10.

- (1) The system of government of the Republic of Poland shall be based on the separation of and balance between the legislative, executive and judicial powers.
- (2) Legislative power shall be vested in the House of Representatives (Sejm) and the Senate, executive power shall be vested in the President of the Republic of Poland and the Council of Ministers, and the judicial power shall be vested in courts and tribunals. ARTICLE 11.
- (1) The Republic of Poland shall ensure freedom for the creation and functioning of political parties. Political parties shall be founded on the principle of voluntariness and upon the equality of Polish citizens, and their purpose shall be to influence the formulation of the policy of the State by democratic means. (2) The financing of political parties shall be open to public inspection.
